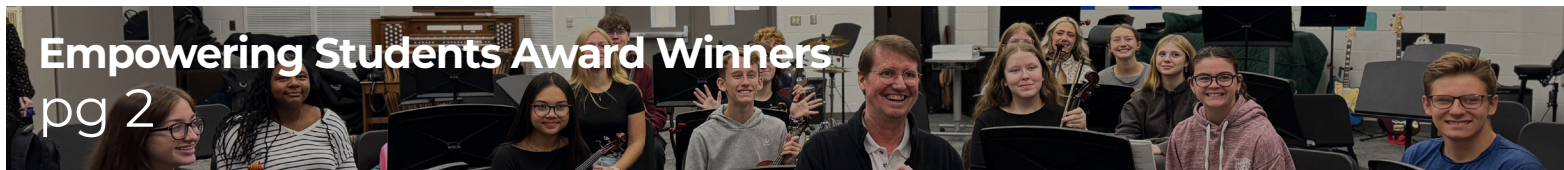

Youth Tour Applications Open; Commitment to Community Scholarships Coming Soon

Hendricks Power sponsors multiple youth programs each year to empower and educate the younger generation in our community. This year, we will continue supporting the Commitment to Community Scholarship and Youth Tour.

Commitment to Community Scholarships will be awarded to current high school seniors pursuing higher education. Applications open January 1, 2026. The co-op will award six scholarships, each worth \$2,000, toward college tuition or a school of higher education. Applications require an essay, high school transcripts, and a letter of recommendation. Completed applications are due by March 6, 2026.

Youth Tour is a week-long, all-inclusive sponsored trip to Washington, D.C., that provides current high school juniors with the opportunity to visit historical sites throughout the city and meet with Indiana's congressional delegation. Applications are now open, and the trip will take place from June 14-21, 2026. Applications are due February 13, 2026.

COLORING CONTEST WINNER!

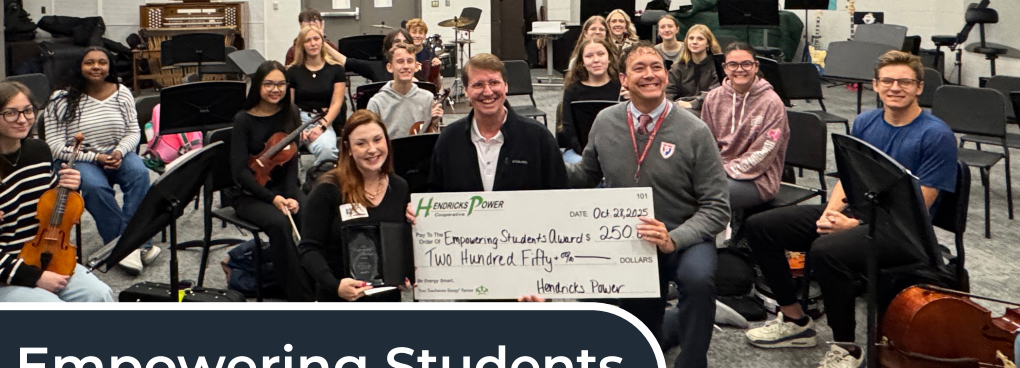
Hendricks Power Cooperative announces the winner of its Coloring Contest, a new initiative designed to inspire creativity and connect with the cooperative's youngest members.

Two local teachers were awarded \$250 for their classrooms in recognition



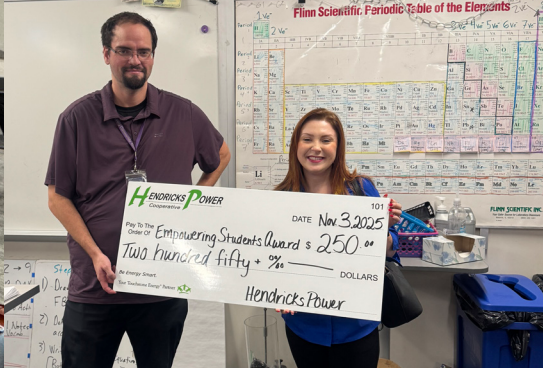
Hendricks Power proudly awarded two Empowering Students Awards to local teachers this fall: Mr. Fredrick Graf from Plainfield High School and Mr. Kevin Dahlstrom from Brownsburg High School. This award honors K-12 teachers who inspire their students and make a meaningful difference in their classrooms. Hendricks Power received an impressive 34 nominations from students, parents, and community members. The winners each received \$250 for educational items from their wish lists, a trophy to celebrate their achievements, and donuts for their schools.

SAFETY TIPS



BE PREPARED FOR Winter Storms

Winter in Indiana often brings weather conditions that can create travel hazards and electrical dangers. Follow these tips to stay safe.

Emergency Kits

Home: Stock at least two weeks of supplies, including bottled water, nonperishable food, emergency blankets, first aid supplies, flashlights, a battery-powered or hand-crank radio, extra batteries, and basic toiletries.

Vehicle: Pack at least three days of essentials such as blankets, warm clothes, jumper cables, bottled water, nonperishable food, sand or cat litter for traction, backup batteries, and phone chargers.

Power Line Safety

If you encounter downed lines, stay at least 35 feet away — about the length of three cars. Never touch the line or anything touching it. Call 911 immediately and warn others to keep clear. Always assume the line is live and dangerous.
