Nearly forty dedicated employees from Hendricks Power recently teamed up with local nonprofits for the cooperative's largest-ever Co-op Community Day. Volunteers spent the day giving back at three local organizations: Strides to Success in Plainfield, Hendricks County Senior Services, and Sheltering Wings in Danville.

At Strides to Success, a nonprofit that partners with horses to provide therapy, learning, and leadership programs, volunteers gardened, cleaned barns and the hayloft, painted and stained in various locations, and helped decorate for their Trot n' Treat community event.

At Hendricks County Senior Services, which offers transportation, meals, and support programs to help older adults live independently, volunteers laid concrete, repaired and beautified the trash enclosure, painted handicap accommodations, and trimmed bushes to enhance the grounds.

At Sheltering Wings, a domestic violence shelter that provides emergency housing, counseling, and advocacy for survivors and their families, volunteers assembled new furniture, organized holiday décor, children's toys, and clothing, and disinfected play areas to ensure a clean and welcoming space.

"Our employees look forward to Community Day every year," said Emily Thomas, Marketing Communications Manager at Hendricks Power. "It's a day where we come together to give back, connect with local nonprofits, and strengthen the communities we're proud to serve."

Co-op Community Day is a statewide initiative that allows Indiana electric cooperative employees to dedicate their time and talents to local service projects. The program reflects the cooperative's long-standing commitment to community involvement and its mission to make a positive impact beyond providing reliable electric service. Twenty-nine electric cooperatives participated in this year's service day.

HOLIDAY SAFETY TIPS



Make the season brighter and safer with fire-safe decorations.

Overloaded circuits can be a serious fire risk during the holidays. Each year, U.S. fire departments respond to about 835 home fires started by decorations, not including Christmas trees, causing deaths, injuries, and millions in damage. Electrical or lighting issues also cause over 40% of Christmas tree fires.

Stay safe this season by installing smoke alarms on every level of your home. Test them monthly, replace the batteries regularly, and make sure your family knows the fire escape plan.

Flame-safe decorations: Opt for items that are flame-resistant or flame-retardant. Use lights properly: Choose indoor and outdoor lights as intended for their specific locations.

Inspect light strings: Replace any worn or broken cords and loose bulb connections. Check tree safety labels: Look for a fire-resistant label on artificial trees.

Pick a fresh tree: If using a real tree, choose one with green needles that don't fall off when touched.

Water your tree daily: Keep it hydrated to reduce fire risk.

Keep trees away from heat: Place trees at least 3 feet away from heat sources and exits. Avoid open flames: Never use lit candles to decorate your tree.
