



HUNT WHAT'S IN SEASON

SHOOTING NEAR ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT CAN BE COSTLY AND DEADLY

HUNTING SEASON BRINGS OUTDOORSMEN INTO RURAL AREAS SOME MIGHT NOT BE FAMILIAR WITH. ELECTRIC COOPERATIVES ASK HUNTERS TO BE AWARE OF ELECTRIC EQUIPMENT AND TO BE MINDFUL WHEN SHOOTING NEAR IT.

Never shoot near or toward overhead power lines, power poles or substations.

Be especially careful in wooded areas where power lines may not be as visible.

Do not use utility poles or towers to support equipment used in your hunting activity or for supporting deer stands.





Electric space heaters

TEMPERATURES ARE DROPPING, AND FAMILIES ARE PULLING OUT THEIR TRUSTY ELECTRIC SPACE HEATERS. BUT DON'T FORSAKE SAFETY FOR CONVENIENCE.



- Make sure the space heater has been tested to the latest standards and is certified by a nationally-recognized testing laboratory, such as Underwriters Laboratories (UL).
- Use only portable space heaters that have an automatic “tip-switch,” which will cause it to turn off automatically if the heater is tipped over or not upright.
- Make sure it has a guard around the flame area or heating element.
- Place the heater on a level, hard, nonflammable surface; do not place on rugs or carpets, near bedding or drapes, or on tables or countertops.
