

Q: LED holiday lights are popular, but are so much more expensive than regular mini lights. Is it worth it to make the switch? - Jennifer, Cloverdale

A: Jennifer, thanks for your question! You have a lot of options for your outdoor holiday lights and it can be tough to decide if it's worth the extra expense to upgrade to LED lights. As you probably already know, LED lights are more energy efficient and cost-effective on your bill, but did you know they're 80 percent more efficient? That also means an 80 percent savings on your holiday light display. Strings of incandescent bulbs, on average, use about 6 times the energy as LEDs! Despite the difference in price, which can be a little steep (around 3x the price in some cases), LED lights actually last longer as well. On average, LED lights are expected to last around 7 x as long as their incandescent counterparts, according to Energy gov.

Hopefully this helps answer your question. If you have the budget to upgrade your lights to LEDs, I would definitely suggest making the switch. The extra few dollars may seem steep, but you're sure to re-coop your costs through your bill. Keep an eye out after the holiday for sales and promotions to get the most bang for your buck! Keeping Warm

DO read the manufacturer's instructions and warning labels carefully before using any space heater or electric blanket.

DON'T leave a space heater or electric heating blanket unattended. Turn it off when you're leaving a room or going

DO inspect heaters for cracked or broken plugs or loose connections before use.

DON'T use the heater if plugs are frayed, worn or damaged.

DON'T use an electric blanket if there are charred or frayed spots.

DO plug space heaters directly into a wall outlet. Do not use an extension cord or power strip, which could overheat and result in a fire.

DON'T use electric blankets while sleeping or as a mattress pad.

HEATING PAD, ELECTRIC BLANKET AND SPACE HEATER SAFETY

DON'T place heaters on cabinets, tables, furniture or carpet, which can overheat and start a fire.

DON'T fold an electric blanket when it's in use. Folded or tucked blankets could overheat and cause a fire.
