

Nominations open on August 5 and must be submitted by midnight on September 6. Only members and employees of a cooperative are eligible to nominate. Winners will be announced in October. ## Ask the Advisor: A/C Efficiency

R: Is it really energy efficient to program my thermostat so my house stays warmer during the day if my A/C unit runs to reduce the temperature when I get home? - Sarah, Avon

Sarah, thanks for your question! This can be a tricky one, especially depending how warm you like to keep it when you and your family aren't home. The short answer is yes. If you're planning to be gone 6-8+ hours, you can increase your efficiency by allowing your A/C unit a little break. The next question would be what to set your thermostat to when you're gone. The US Department of Energy advises that turning your thermostat 7 to 10 degrees warmer when you're not home could save you as much as 10% on your bill. The Department also states that the more mild the

weather, the more efficient your unit is.

That being said, another tip is to set your thermostat to your desired comfortable temperature a half hour before coming home for the day. You won't even know the difference and you'll be saving money! If you don't have a programmable thermostat, you may have the urge to set your thermostat at a cooler temperature in hopes that your home will cool down faster and this is where you may run into trouble. This "strategy" will not cool your home any faster and may result in wasted energy.

If you haven't already, be sure to purchase a programmable or smart thermostat so you don't have to remember to make these adjustments everyday. If you find that you're not saving as much as you'd hoped, there may be other ways to increase your efficiency, including adding extra insulation, upgraded window treatments, and even using additional fans throughout your home.
