SAFETY FIRST

Lineworkers must commit to safety above all else for the benefit of those they serve (you!), fellow crew members and themselves. They spend thousands of hours in safety trainings each year and must learn how to apply numerous safety regulations.

THEY ARE SPECIALLY TRAINED TO:

Climb poles to service power lines in areas inaccessible by trucks, stand in an elevated bucket to assess and repair overhead lines, install poles, overhead lines, and other equipment, work on energized and deenergized lines, and install and service underground lines

Directors serve three-year terms and have monthly board meetings.
